GENERAL NOTICE OF REGISTRABLE INTERESTS

Employment, office, trade, profession or vocation:

4. Where you hold an office, give the name of the person or body which appointed you. In the case of a teacher in a maintained school, the local authority; in the case of an aided school, the school's governing body.

Sponsorship:

5. You should declare the name of any person or body who has made any payments to you in the last year towards your expenses as a Police Authority Member. You do not need to declare the amounts of any payments - only the name of the person or body making them. [Councillor Members are not required to give details of payments towards election expenses in their notice for the Police Authority Register, since they are appointed, not elected, to the Police Authority].

Contracts with the Authority:

6. You should describe all contracts, of which you are aware, which are not fully discharged and which are:
- (a) contracts for the supply of goods, services or works to the Police Authority or on the Police Authority's behalf and
 - (b) between the Police Authority of which you are a Member and either yourself or a company in which you have a beneficial interest or of which you are a partner or director, or have any corporate interests.
7. You need not say what the financial arrangements are, but you should say for how long the contract is.

8. Licences to Occupy Land:

11. You should include land in the area of the Police Authority which you (alone or with others) have a right to occupy for 28 days or more, but neither own nor have a tenancy of it. You should give the address or a brief description to identify it.
12. 'Land' includes buildings or parts of buildings.

Corporate Tenancies:

13. You should list any tenancies of property of which you are aware where the landlord is the Police Authority of which you are a Member and the tenant is a company in which you have a beneficial interest, or of which you are a director.

15. You have a beneficial interest if you own shares or other securities in the company with a nominal value of more than £25,000 or more than 1/100th of the issues shares or securities. If there are several classes of shares or securities, the fraction of 1/100th applies to any of those classes. These limits also apply to deposits with industrial and provident societies, and co-operative societies.
16. A company or body corporate is active in the Police Authority's area if it has land or a place of business in that area.
17. The requirement also covers shares and securities held in the name of other people, in which you have a beneficial interest.

18. You should declare membership of, or position of general control or management in:

 - other public authorities or organisations which deliver public services;
