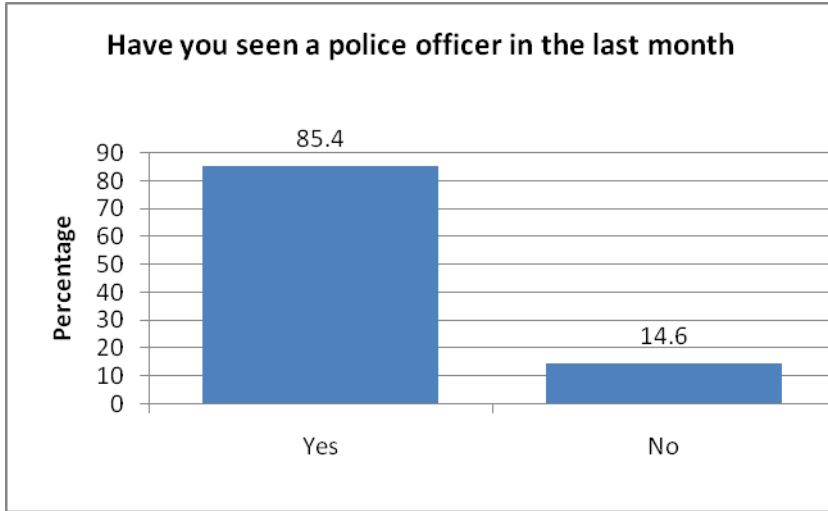


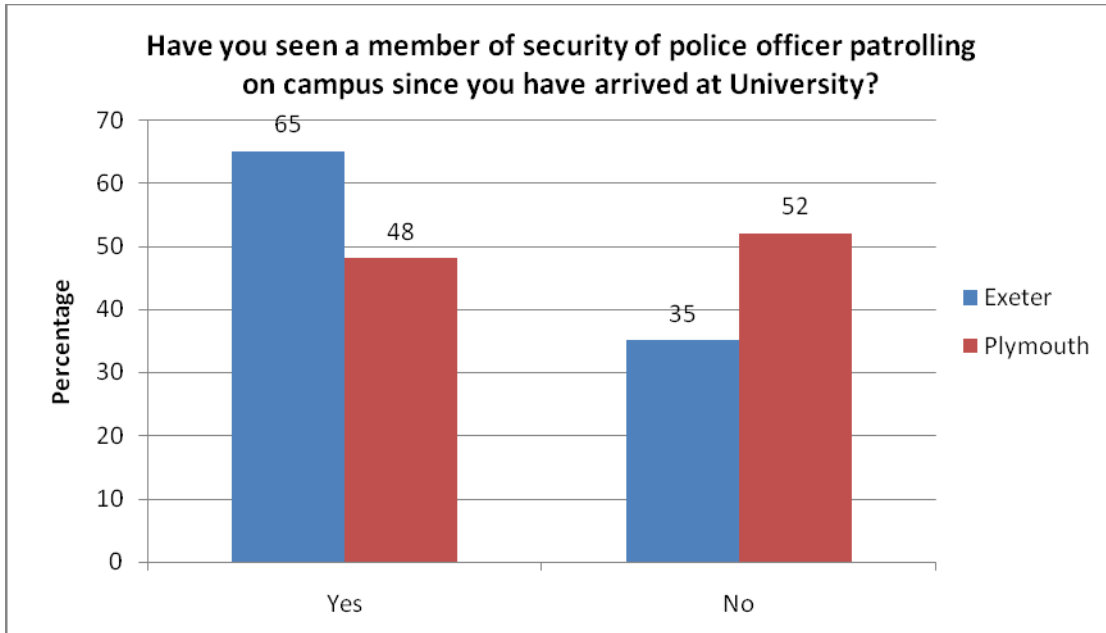
Visibility

A variety of questions were asked at the events the Police Authority consulted at. The results are presented according to each event(s).

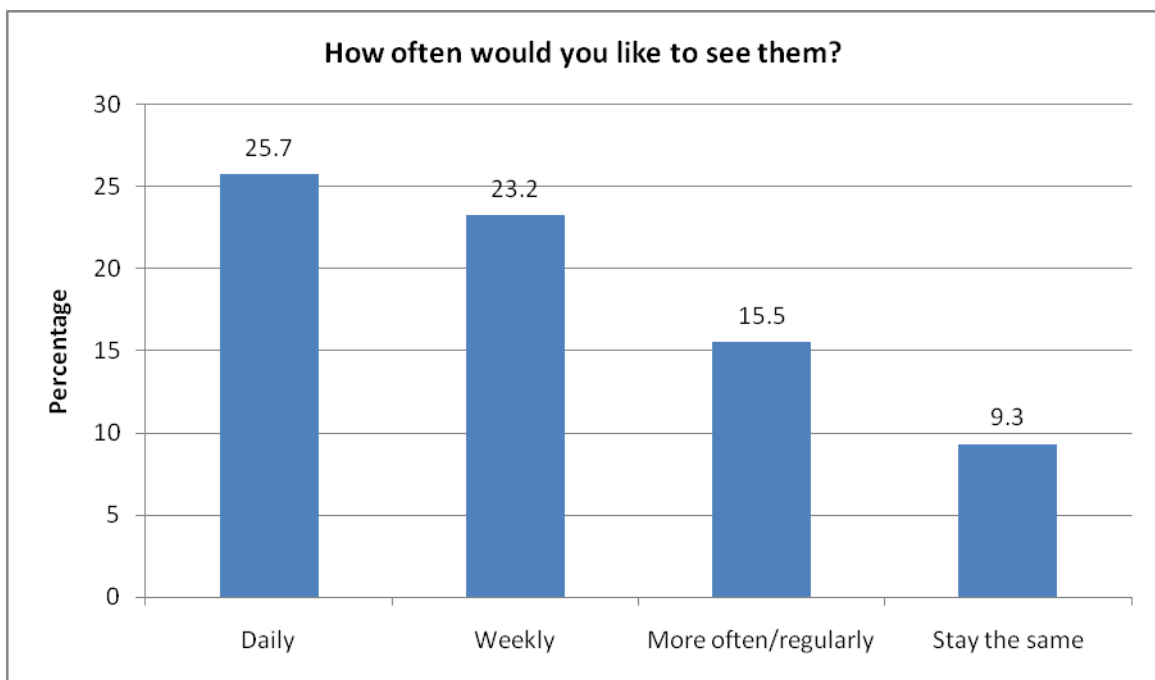
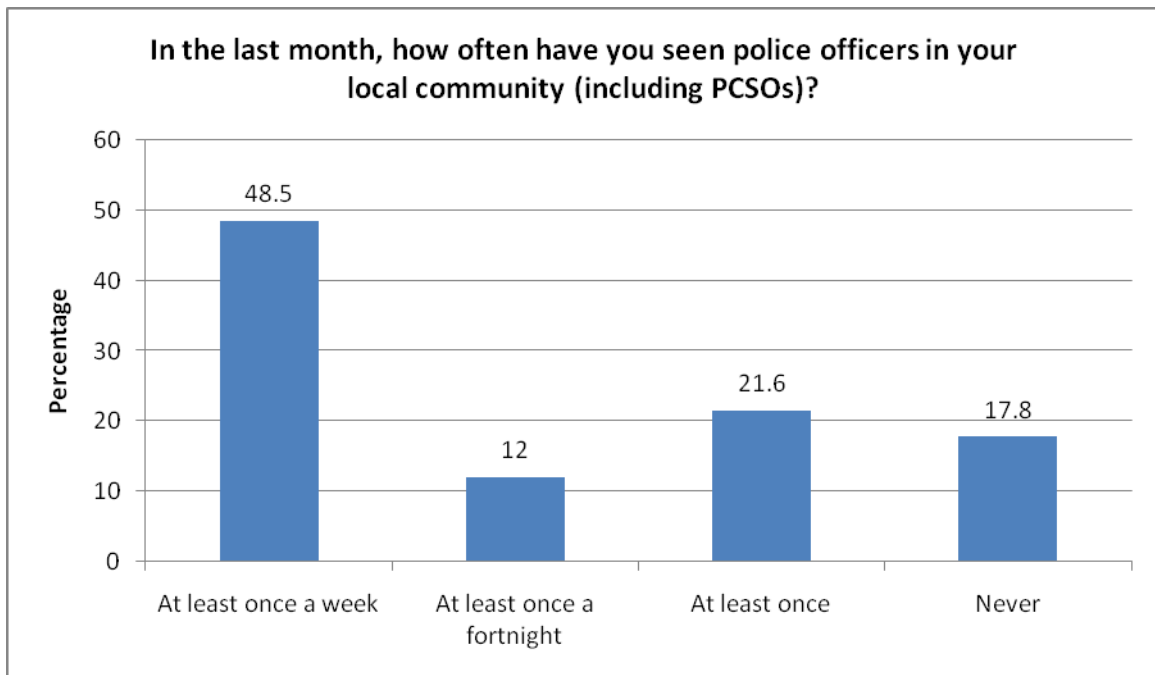
Youth Consultation (Kongomana)

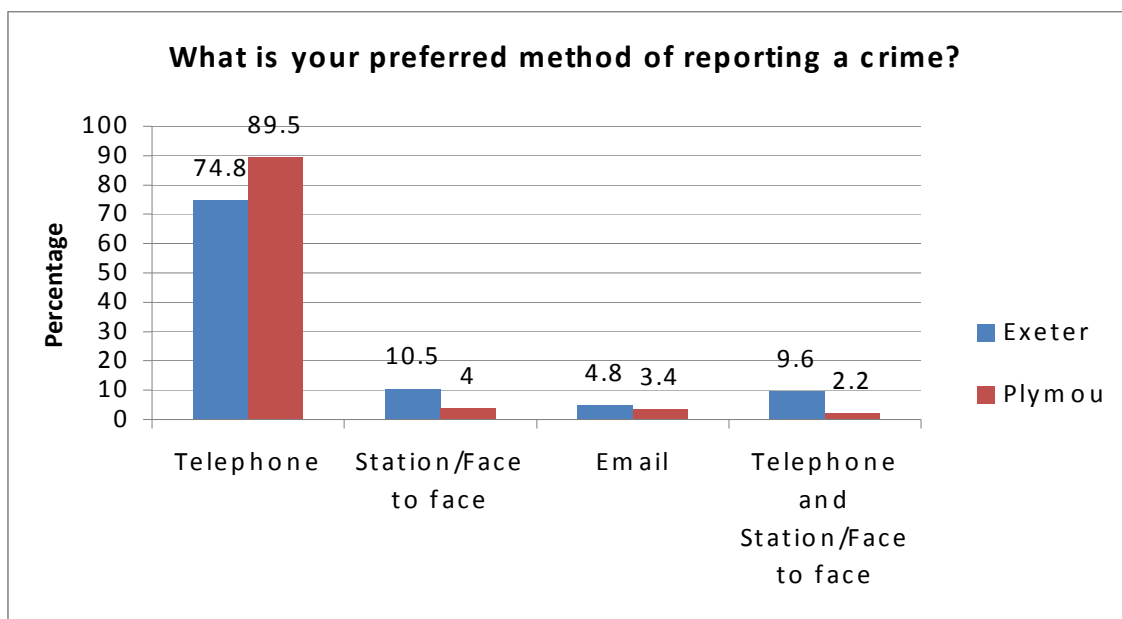
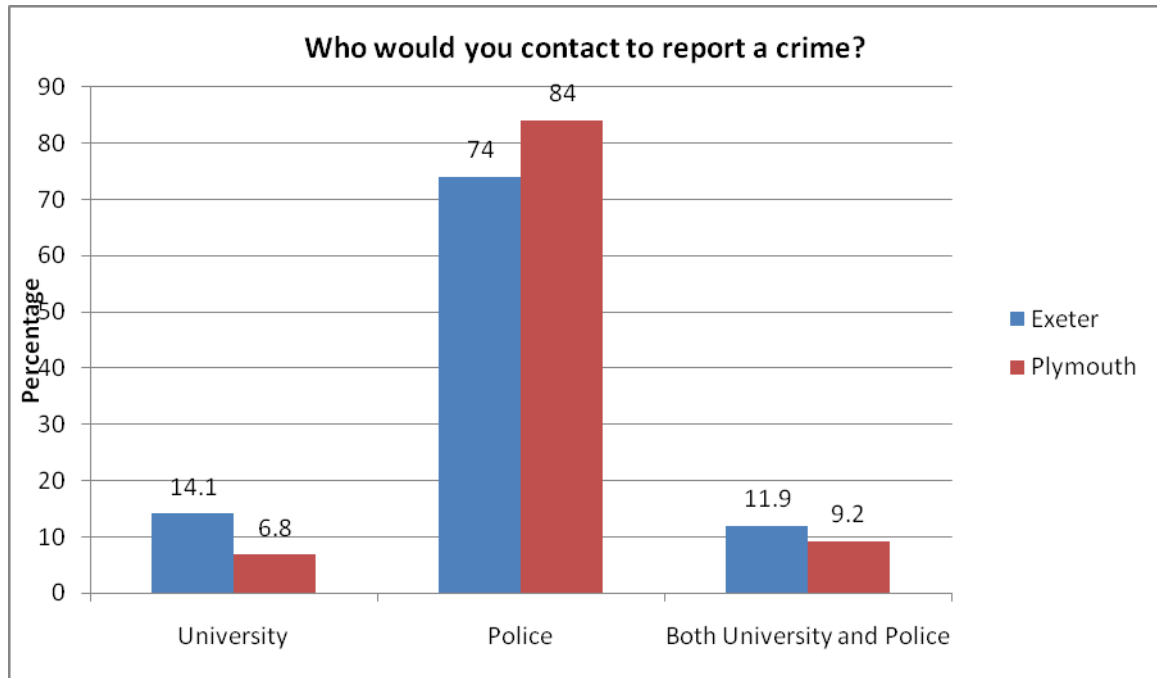

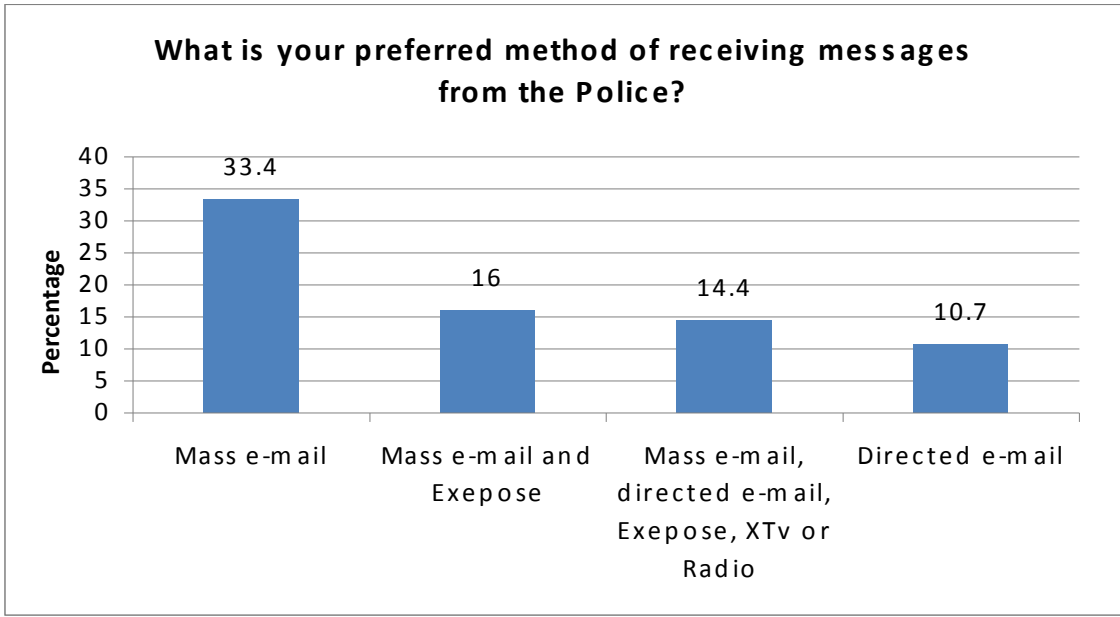
Summary: The results show that the public would like to see police officers more often, with the majority of the public stating that they would like to see police officers on a daily basis.

## Ease and Quality of Contact

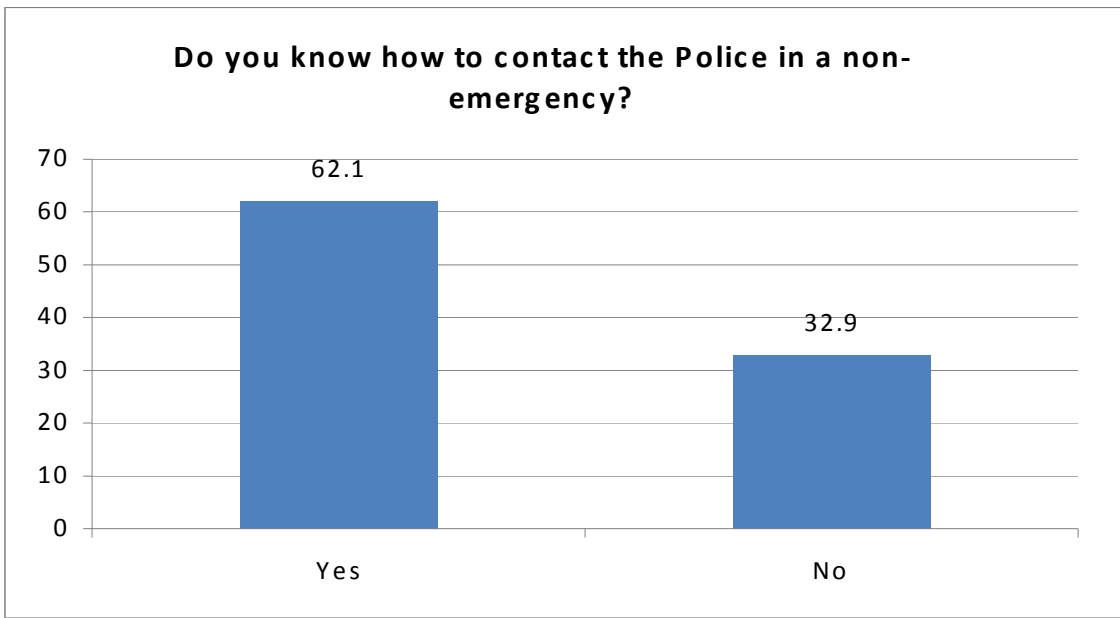
Questions related to how members of the public may contact the police were asked and preferred methods of communication explored.

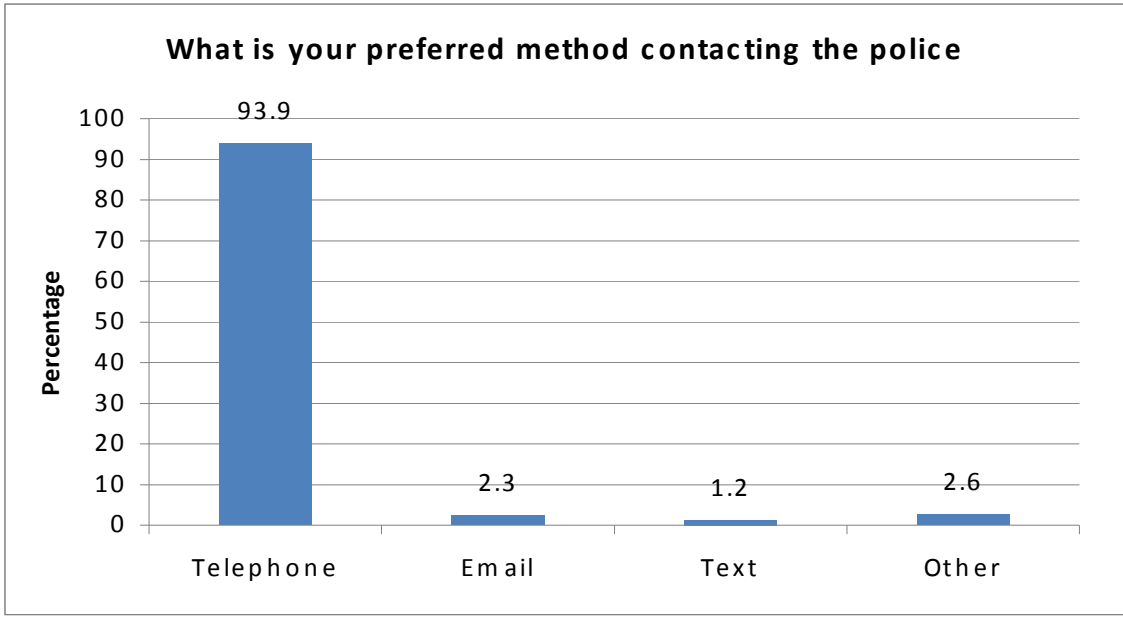

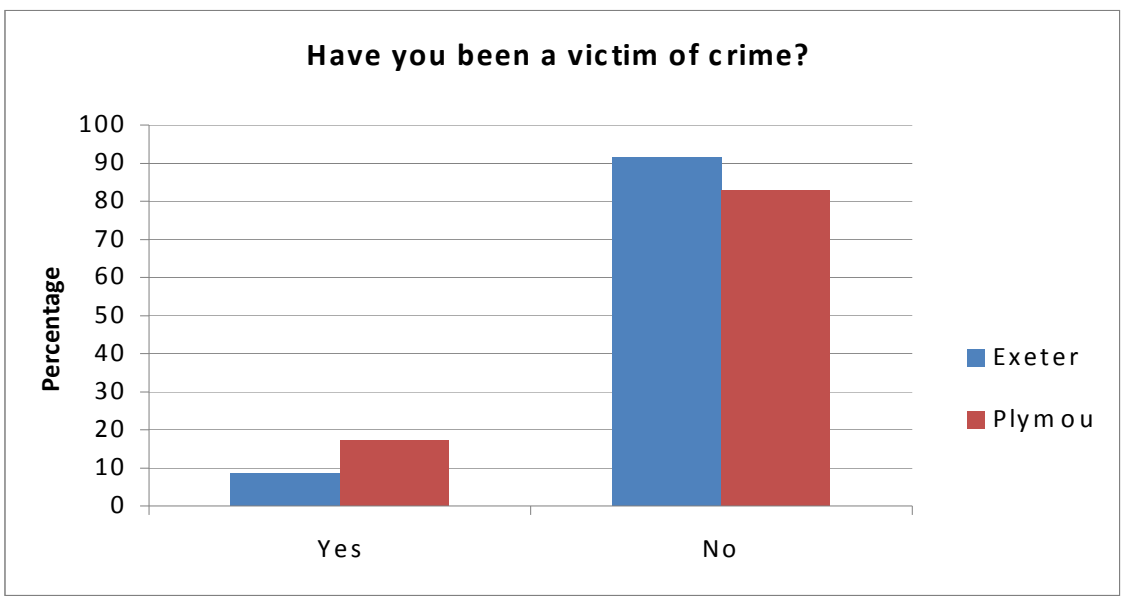
Panels

Both panels believed that the 08452 number should be publicised more than the 999 number. In addition to this, all the material that the police produce, e.g. PACT cards, wallet sized contact cards, etc, should be readily available to the public in places they would regularly visit. Clearer communication between the police and public is needed overall in terms of how to contact police, attend meetings, and general activities that the police do.

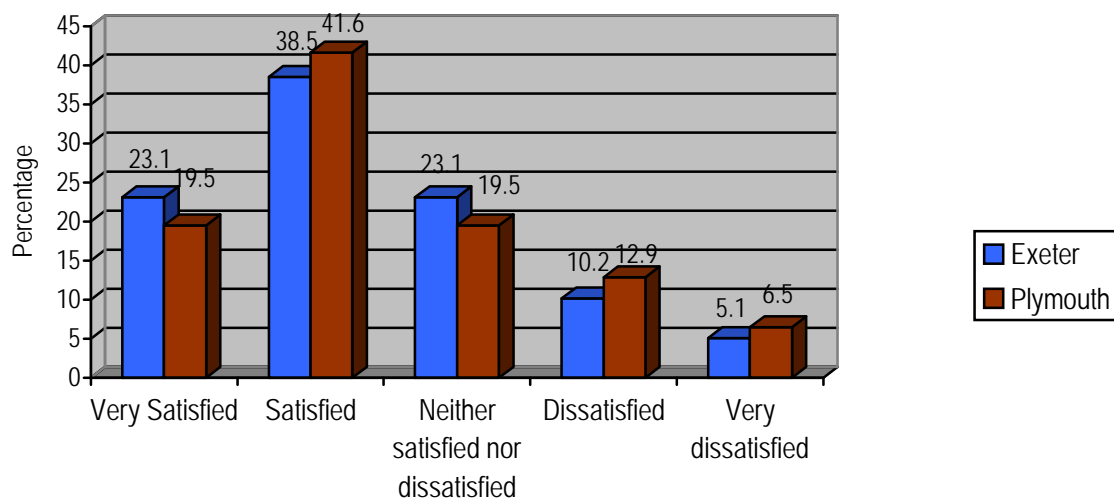
Confidence and Perception of Policing/Police Officers

Questions pertaining to the confidence levels of members of the public including how they perceive the police in general were asked at the different events.

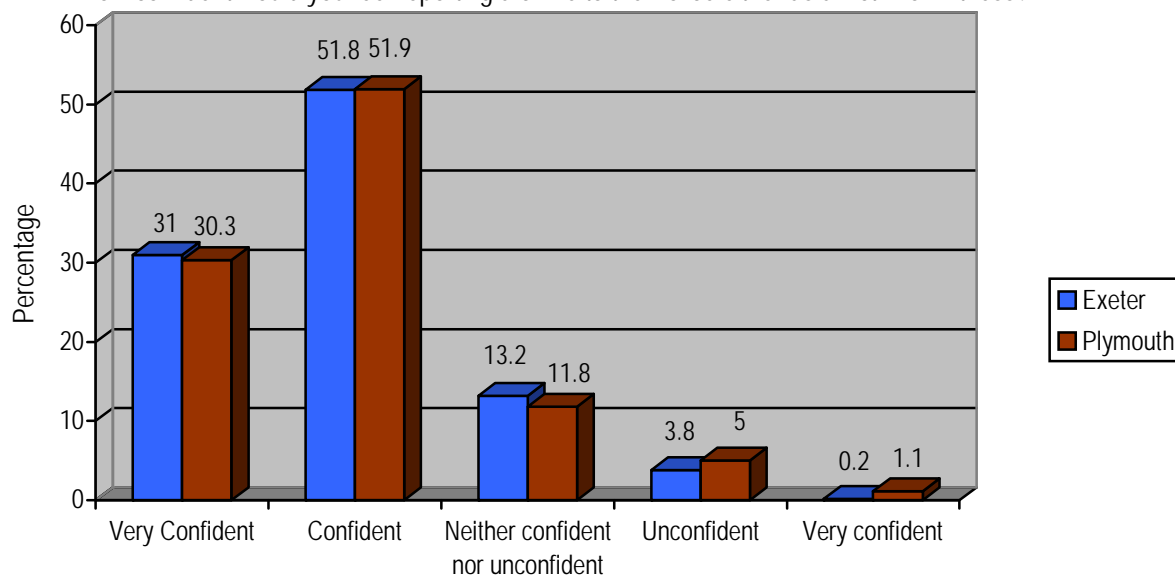

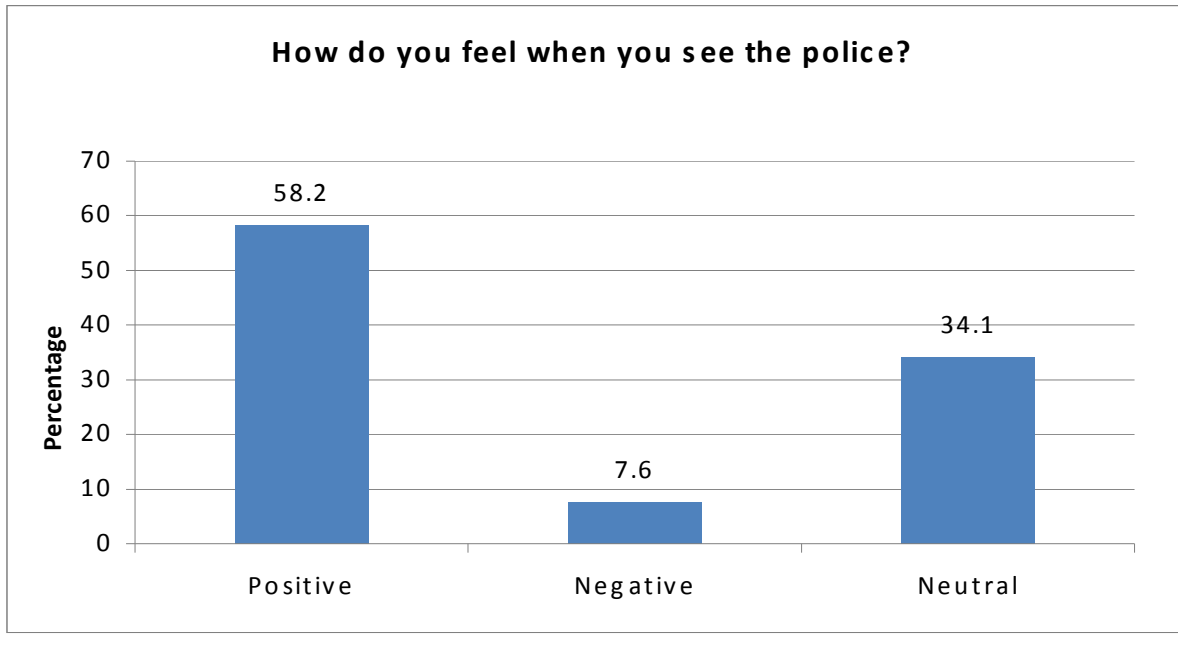


How satisfied were you with the service you received?
